

The Seattle Meatcutters Apprenticeship was established as a union-sponsored apprenticeship school on May 17, 1946 to increase the skills, abilities, and knowledge of meatcutters, which in turn led to higher wages and benefits for these highly trained workers. Trained and licensed meatcutters make our industry safer and more productive, and meatcutters have long served our communities with pride.

Throughout its long history, this program has grown and changed, expanding the diversity of its apprentices and graduates and continuing to do so through robust recruitment and leadership development. As we celebrate its legacy, the program also has a bright future in partnership with UFCW

3000, represented Employers, the State of Washington, and the exciting new nonprofit organization WeTrain Washington.

### **NEWS FROM ACROSS OUR UNION**



Who's dat Rat? "Scabby" has been an icon of American labor disputes for many years, popping up at and strikes and actions all over the country! Our Scabby has been particularly busy recently standing strong on ULP strike with Nurses in Everett, Macy's workers across the state, and most recently with Technical workers at Sacred Heart in Spokane! Employers like Providence and Macy's can't try to scab over their unfair policies and practices or scratch and gnaw away at our benefits and wages unless they want to face a ten-foot reminder! Thanks Scabby for joining us on the picket line!

#### **SOME HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE LAST QUARTER:**

After months of strike preparation, store actions, and long negotiation sessions, Grocery East members won dramatic gains for Eastern Washington and Oregon, and historic gains for unionized grocery stores in Idaho. "This is the most money I thought I'd ever see coming out of Kroger. The pressure we applied across all our stores was amazing! I am feeling amazed!" - Katrina Keffer, Fred Meyer

After the 2022 **Grocery West** contract win, some members who had transitioned into a managerial position faced the removal of their legacy pay rates from the contract. Fortunately, we successfully reinstated these legacy rates for affected members, resulting in almost \$17,000 in back pay. Currently, our Membership Resource Center is in the process of resolving several ongoing group grievances, like general merchandise receiver pay at Fred Meyer and back pay issues for Safeway employees who departed prior to the implementation of wage increases.

Providence Sacred Heart Medical Center Techs in Spokane went on an 8.5-day unfair labor practice strike to stand up against Providence's disregard for the law and to demand respect and much-needed resources to help retain and recruit the quality health care workers needed to maintain the only level 2 trauma center hospital in the area. Members were supported by hundreds of community members, labor allies, legislators, and pets!



Laundry members at Service Linen, Superior Linen, and Tomlinson Linen are joining together to organize for fair and dignified wages and improved benefits. For the first time, members are meeting together regularly for multilingual organizing meetings and wore UFCW yellow shirts to work in a joint solidarity action on May 1, International Worker's Day.

Over 2,100 members at MultiCare Health Systems in Pierce and South King Counties have been in contract negotiations since February. While we have been focused on addressing MultiCare's below-market wages plus access and affordability, for the Employer's healthcare plan, MultiCare has been dragging their feet in negotiations and has rejected all of our proposals. "We're ready to work together, but it takes two sides willing to engage. MultiCare needs to step up and show they're serious about reaching an agreement."
