Ensure Uninterrupted Meal and Rest Breaks

Health care professionals are expected to always be prepared and on top of their game - patients' lives depend on it. Working 10, 12 or even more hours in a row because hospital CEOs didn't schedule well enough is not good for providers or our patients. Hospital workers need uninterrupted breaks to make sure patients receive quality care.

Close the Mandatory Overtime Loophole

It has become the norm for on-call health care professionals to fill in during staff shortages rather than emergency situations. Hospitals need to stop forcing mandatory on-call for non-emergency situations and restrict the use of pre-scheduled on-call. This protection must extend to all health care workers that provide direct patient care.

Billing and Medical Debt

When you're facing a health emergency it can be hard to navigate confusing health insurance networks. You just need help, not a fear of crushing medical debt. Due to lack of transparency in hospital billing practices, out-of-network care can result in an unexpected and costly bill long after you've paid your co-pay and received care. Our health care spending should go towards our health care, not to a debt collector or surprise bills.

Properly Fund Public Hospitals

In order to provide the patient care Washington needs, it is critical that our public hospitals are funded adequately. With the federal government's recent multi-million dollar cuts to our rural public district hospitals it is crucial that we work with the legislature to ensure our hospitals have the resources they need to care for our communities.

Enact Secure Scheduling

People cannot make ends meet if they do not get enough hours. Workers cannot plan their lives if they have erratic shifts or do not get advance notice of their schedules. Scheduling is not just an economic issue, but also a community issue, an equity issue, and a health issue. Workers need stability, predictability, and flexibility in their schedules.

End Unjust Non-Compete Clauses

In an economy where employers are hiring an increasingly part-time work force and many workers must take a second job just to make ends meet, non-compete clauses as a condition of employment are causing an unreasonable strain on workers. These unfair restrictions should not be allowed in most employment situations.

Protect Workers From Sexual Harassment

Workers should not have to worry about being victims of sexual harassment while they are earning a living. Current sexual harassment laws do not do enough to protect the most vulnerable workers. We must pass protections that not only make it easier for victims to report abuse but hold employers accountable when no action is taken.

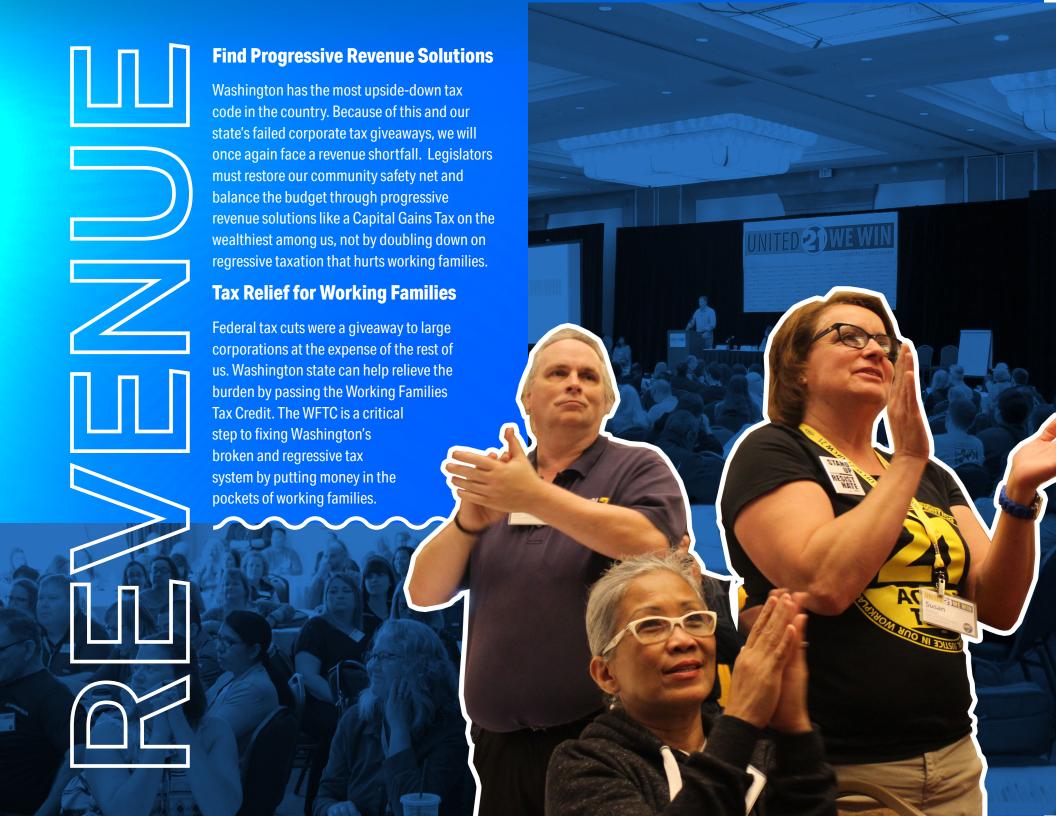

Lower Housing Costs

People across the state are struggling to keep up with the rising cost of living. Housing costs in particular have skyrocketed. We must put pressure on legislators to fund affordable housing programs and reduce barriers to building more affordable housing.

Make Childcare Affordable

Everyone should have access to quality, affordable childcare in their own community. When working families cannot afford childcare, they cannot afford to work. And when childcare workers can't make a living, they can't provide the safe, high-quality care that is so crucial. We need to find progressive solutions that lower childcare costs for working families, increase access and opportunities for kids, and treat childcare workers with the respect they deserve.

Protect At-Risk Communities

Over the past two years, there has been an alarming increase in anti-immigrant, anti-Muslim, homophobic and racist rhetoric – coming from the highest levels of

our government. These attacks on our most atrisk communities cannot stand. With the Keep Washington Working bill we can ensure our immigrant workforce can continue to live and work with dignity.





Increase Labor Standards for Cannabis Workers

The workers who make the cannabis industry possible cannot get left behind. Over the last three years cannabis sales in Washington have nearly tripled. It is essential that as this industry continues to grow, workers receive fair wages, good benefits and a healthy work-life balance. We must work to pass legislation that rewards cannabis companies who support their workers' right to form a union and collectively bargain a fair contract.

Vacate Marijuana Misdemeanor Convictions

Now that Washington has legalized recreational cannabis use, we should stop holding a person's past cannabis possession against them. While some people are getting rich off of legalization others are still being punished for what is no longer a crime. These convictions disproportionately and unjustly impact communities of color. It is time to vacate these convictions and no longer allow misdemeanor cannabis offenses to negatively impact a person's life.
